The ORBITS program is focused on the development and exploration of career skills and transferable life skills of first generation, second year, and third year transfer UCR students.

A first generation college student is defined as a student who is attending a four-year college to earn a bachelor's degree, but their parents/guardians did not obtain a bachelor's degree. (*NACE Journal*, Nov. 2016)

Obtain Resources

Students in the ORBITS program are able to obtain valuable campus and career resources. The second year of college is an important time to choose a major, explore careers, and develop skills. ORBITS students will access resources on resume and cover letter writing, interviewing, preparing for graduate school, searching for jobs and internships, and choosing a major.

Become Informed

ORBITS students become informed with the resources they have already received, and continue the development of career and life skills. They will engage in activities such as informational interviews, employer discussions, panels, and on-site visits, plus enhance their transferable skills focusing on communication, work ethic, leadership, and teamwork.

Target Success

A long-term goal of the ORBITS program is for students to graduate from UCR understanding the steps for pursuing graduate school or a job search. Students will also develop a personal plan to include short-term target goals leading up to graduation.

- The program will involve short readings, experiential exercises and activities, small group discussions, and reflective exercises.
